HAVE A BETTER KITCHEN

Having a better kitchen doesn't always mean a major overhaul job on the room or the equipment.

Sometimes a kitchen can be given an extra touch of convenence by the addition of a single cabinet or by relocating equip-ment already in the kitchen.



For example, take a simple whatnot shelf. Ordinarily it is installed in a vertical position against the side of a wall cabinet. It is mainly decorative, providing a place to display small potted plants, small vases and other "gadgets" that the homemaker uses to brighten up her

Here's how to turn that decorative what-not shelf into a really useful piece of kitchen equipment, according to the Youngstown Kitchens Planning Service. Simply turn the shelf on its side and attach it to the wall above the sink or above the range. It becomes a broad shelf, still highly decorative, on which to keep condiments or small kitchen accessories within finger-tip reach. Store the cook book there, or your file of recipes.

Used in this manner, the ordinary what-not shelf provides a storage area 10 inches deep and 30 inches long, divided into three compartments. It is seven inches high. Thus it takes but little wall space, but provides a great deal of con-


