





ANTI-FREEZE QUIZ FOR MOTORISTS

ANSWER: (B). Tests show the average car loses between 1 and 2 quarts of anti-freeze solution every 1000 miles, when using the proper thermostat, most of it through overflow. Less than one-half pint of volatile type anti-freeze is lost through evaporation.

ANSWER: (A). Throw away your old anti-freeze. During use, it can become contaminated and cause serious damage if left in your car indefinitely. The chemical test to determine if it can be used again

ANSWER: (B). Anti-freeze should be put in your car before the first killing frost, Check with the nearest U.S. Weather Bureau office

ANSWER: (B). The model of a car has nothing to do with anti-

freeze. You're safe in using a reliable standard-priced anti-freeze like Zerone unless you drive at high altitudes or in temperatures below 30 degrees Fahrenheit or if your car has a "high-opening" thermostat.

In these cases, a good premium-priced product like Zerex is needed.
