

During the February 20 meeting of the Mill City Chamber of Commerce the urgency of local action towards a Santiam Canyon association was discussed. Following his election at a Mill City Chamber of Commerce board of directors meeting as chamber president, Glen V. Sorensen reviewed the need for stepped up activity, and, with the approval of the chamber board of directors, called an entire chamber membership meeting for Tuesday, February 26, for the announced purpose of then and there getting the ball rolling.

Recently the Stayton Chamber of Commerce elected L. H. Wright, Gene Teague, and Lloyd Girod, as a three-man committee on formation of a Canyon-wide organization which will center its promotional activity in Mill City.
