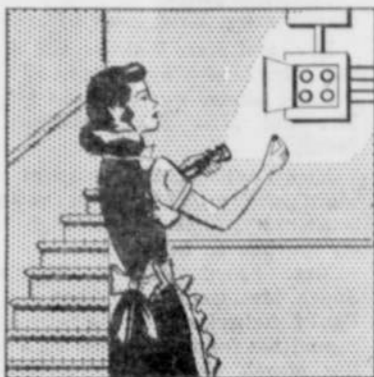
Defense Director Studies Program

Climaxing a series of civil defense meetings on the state level, Director Jack Hayes met last Thursday in Salem with state officials for study of state and local participation in the federal matching-fund program, and the work of new committees on training, public information and plant protection. Salem will be the site of the state civil defense headquarters. The state group has the responsibility of guidance assistance and co-ordination in the over-all picture. Hayes emphasized that local governments have the responsibility of organizing civil defense in their areas. "Local sub-divisions have the personnel and equipment needed," he said, "and the state will help in co-ordination." Eight basic civil defense manuals

will be framed immediately by the state CD group. Preparing the manuals is an interim step, since the timetable of the proposed 30-odd manuals to be printed by FCDA isn't known, Hayes said. "There's an immediate need for setting up training programs for fire, medical, rescue and other services," he said. "We'll tailor the booklets for our needs in Oregon, and they'll be mimeographed or produced in some other inexpensive form." Twenty-five thousand civil defense worker identification cards have been printed for distribution to local and county CD officials. Uniform personnel and inventory survey forms will be furnished to local leaders without charge. One of the important things right now is getting the facts to the people, said Hayes commenting upon the wisdom of having public information directors on both state and local levels. State CD public information committee was organized in Salem recently.

HAVE A BETTER KITCHEN

Is your kitchen sink working for you or against you? Perhaps it's time to cast a critical eye at that very important piece of kitchen equipment to see whether it's saving you work or causing it. First, does your sink fill your particular needs? Is it big enough to adequately handle the cleaning and food preparation jobs that are concentrated in this area? If kitchen space will allow, the larger steel cabinet sink models provide a great deal of storage space and work surface right where you need it most. While size is important, there are many other factors to consider in the purchase of a cabinet sink. Because this is a long term investment, it is best to buy one of high quality even though the original cost may be slightly greater. Take a sharp look at its construction. Note whether the doors and drawers are sound deadened and how easily the drawers slide. You will undoubtedly want a top of porcelain enamel, for porcelain is attractive, sanitary, easy to clean and will wear indefinitely. Look at the advantages of a double bowl sink—you'll find that dishwashing can be speeded considerably by using one bowl for washing and the other for rinsing. Your new cabinet sink should have recessed front to provide knee room and a recessed toe space to make working at the unit easier on the legs and back. Deluxe models have other features, too, that take the drudgery from kitchen work—such as a handy soap-box rack on the undersink compartment door; compartmented drawers for cutlery, and a rinse spray. Think of the cabinet sink as a labor saving device and insist that your new one be the kind that will lighten the kitchen load.
