Mill City Grade School Takes Second Place In Canyon-wide Track Jamboree Monday

Mill City grade school settled for second place in the Canyon-wide track jamboree Monday afternoon on the Mill City grade school athletic field. St. Mary's Catholic parochial school of Stayton took an impressive array of firsts and seconds while winning first prize trophy.

Stayton grade school came in third, and Detroit ended up fourth when the final tallies were made by scorekeepers Mrs. Fern Sletto and Miss Sigri Grimstead of Mill City.

Pupils from these four schools were divided into four age groups, those under 10, those under 12, those under 14, and those under 16. The various schools entered contestants in seven events, dash, standing broad jump, running broad jump, accuracy throw (for girls), relay, and potato race (boys and girls under 12).

Charles Golden won first place for Mill City in his age group in the dash, relay, running broad jump, and standing broad jump. Kenny Andrews, 14, took two firsts, one in the dash and one in the relay and won fourth place in the running broad jump. Frances Ward, 12, and Clara Caudle, 12, captured first and second place respectively in the girls dash event. Ronald Williams, 12, and Arthur Webb, 12, came in first and

second on the running broad jump for Mill City. Linda Donaldson, 10, got first in the ball throw.

Sibyl Dart, 12, and Frances Ward, 12, helped out Mill City by winning second and third place respectively for Mill City in the accuracy, ball throw. Sibyl won second in the potato relay also. Shirley Cree, 14, placed second in the girls relay—under 16—group, third in her own age group relay and fourth in the girls' dash. Pauline Christensen, 16, earned high honors for Mill City for her age group in the girls' dash event by winning second.

Phil Carey, 16, placed third in the dash and fourth in the standing broad jump for Mill City. Don Howe, 10, Duane Niemeyer, 12, and Truman Jones, 14, each placed third in the standing broad jump event Monday.

Howe was third highest also in the running broad jump; and Arnold Webb, 16, landed in number four slot. Myrna Roy, 16, scored third in the girls' accuracy throw competition. Gail Purvis, 10, managed a third place win for Mill City in the potato relay and the dash. Anthony Beery, 14, finished fourth for his age group for Mill City in the dash.

Boy and girl athletes of St. Mary's clearly showed their ability and prowess by capturing 16 firsts and 11 seconds. Darlene Klamp, 12, Frances Peters, 14, and Catherine Mack, 16, placed first in their respective age groups in the accuracy throw competition for St. Mary's. Allen Boedigheimer, 12, placed highest in the dash and relay. St. Mary's Billy Burrell, 10, spurted into first place in the dash, standing broad jump, and second in the running broad jump.

Another high scorer for St. Mary's was Jimmy Foltz, 10, running broad jump and relay firsts; dash and standing broad jump seconds. Other St. Mary's high pointers were Norman Geraths, 12, standing broad jump; Harold Peitrok, 14, standing broad jump first, relay third, and running broad jump second; Robert Trahan, 12, dash third, standing broad jump second, and running broad jump third; Robert Fery, 14, dash third and running broad jump first; Lanita Boedigheimer, 14, girls' relay first; Lucille Schmitz, 16, girls' relay first; Lucille Hoffman, 10, potato race first and girls' dash, fourth; Donna Welter, 12, potato race first and girls' dash, fourth; Gary Nokolby, 10, potato race second; Myrna Ann Minten, 10, potato race second; Darlene Boedigheimer, 12, potato race third and dash third; Barbara Bischoff, 10, dash second; Harry Pietrok, 14, standing broad jump second; Lucille Hoffman, 10, accuracy throw, third; Darla Darby, 16, girls' dash, third; Joan Albus, 14, girls' dash tied for third; Laneda Minten, 10, accuracy throw, fourth; Carol Frank, 16, accuracy throw, fourth; Dennis Sullivan, 16, boys' relay, fourth; and George Beitel, 12, running broad jump, fourth.

Stayton got seven second places and two firsts. The two firsts were won by girls, Clandine Whisenhunt and Dorothy Frank in the girls' dash event. Becky Stoll of Detroit placed first in the girls' dash in the under 10 age group. Lloyd Ketchum and Erlene Smedley of Detroit grabbed two second wins, one in the running broad jump and one in the girls relay. Two Detroit girls, Muriel Powell and Anna Bess Carte tied for fourth place in the accuracy throw in the 14 year old group.
