DETROIT

District Ranger of the Willamette forest at Detroit states that the potential fire hazard is great in the forests at this time. This year has been the driest in the last thirty years. The water and sewage disposal plant construction work for the new ranger station has been given to the Eugene Rudy Company also of Portland. It has been stated that these buildings will be completed by approximately the first of the year.
