### Methodists Staging Special Programs

The Mill City Free Methodist church has set aside Sunday, Oct. 7, as a special Sunday school rally day, according to G. E. Davidson, superintendent of the Sunday school.

Davidson extended a cordial invitation to the public for the special Sunday rally day, and during the revival services starting Wednesday, Oct. 10, to Oct. 21. The new pastor of the Mill City Free Methodist church, Rev. C. O. Tremain, will conduct the special revival services.

### Emergency Routes Being Scheduled

Civil defense organizations that send assistance to other areas in the event of a war-caused disaster will travel on predesignated emergency routes, reported the state civil defense office.

Primary and secondary routes will be designated for emergency use in the near future. The main concern will be keeping routes clear for inbound traffic so that fire equipment, rescue units, first aid teams, and other mobile teams can reach the stricken area in the shortest possible time.

The state civil defense office named a committee who will locate the best sites for erecting blockades on roads which have been designated as primary routes by the state highway department. The blockades will prevent motorists from jamming high priority roads, which would interfere with the passage of emergency vehicles from outside areas.

Several problems in traffic control, such as identification of vehicles and the type of signs for emergency roads, are being studied at present by the state police and state highway departments, which are integral parts of the state civil defense organization.

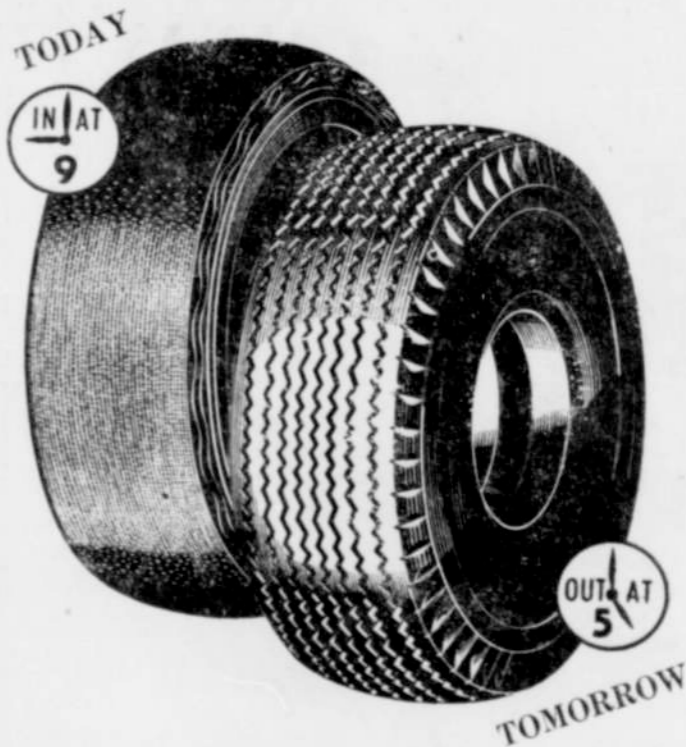
