According to the noted authority on botany, Asa Gray, the sharp projections on rose bushes are not thorns at all, but are "prickles." A thorn is a spine or sharp process of a degenerate branch which is leafless and indurated. The prickles of rose bushes are merely outgrowths of the bark and do not approach the definition of a thorn, which is something quite different.
