

New Detroit Site Nearing Readiness

The tractor from the Hammond Lumber company in Sweet Home was returned to that vicinity today having been for the past five or six weeks clearing and assisting in burning on the lots in the Hammond addition to Detroit in the vicinity of the grade school. A number of lots have been sold in that addition in the past few weeks and there is considerable activity there.

Ray Sophy who finished burning on his lots two or three weeks ago is busy with forms and with pouring of cement in preparation for his new store which it is planned will be a General merchandise store and which will include two lots with fronts on three streets one of those being the new highway building.

Guy Moore is erecting a building which was to have been the new post-office but which has been leased to the Benton-Lincoln electric company as an office. The lot for the new telephone office has been cleared and there is to be work started soon. The Christian church at Detroit has selected a lot which the Hammond lumber company is donating to the church. This lot together with one which the church will purchase is fairly centrally located. The present church building has not yet been purchased by the army engineers.

Detroit Parents Discuss Schools

Mrs. Agnes Booth, superintendent of Marion County schools was present at a meeting of parents called by the Detroit school board in the school gymnasium on Tuesday evening of this week. The meeting was for the purpose of discussing the disposition of the high school in this community, the present building being available only until June 1st.

Mr. Otis White, superintendent of Detroit schools reviewed briefly the previous meetings held on this subject at Gates and Mill City and bringing them up to date presented Mrs. Booth who outlined ways and means for the school board and community to proceed in the disposition.

Mrs. Booth stated that there are four ways they might proceed and felt it only fair that she should outline for them all four ways and let them choose. No. 1. Keep the school here and build a new high school. This would not be difficult she explained since there is only an indebtedness of \$500 against the school. No. 2. She suggested that they might form a Union high school district with some other school to educate their boys and girls. No. 3. She said they might consolidate with Mill City and Gates as had been suggested at an earlier meeting held in Mill City with Mr. Turnbull of the State Department. No. 4. She said they form a Union high school district which in her opinion was merely a back door to consolidation. When asked by a parent what her choice would be she said consolidation, since it was the most economical from the standpoint of teachers, textbooks and school room space as well as administration.

Following Mrs. Booth's departure Mr. White again took the chair for further discussion and a motion was made by Ray Sophy that the petition now in the hands of the clerk Jim Gordon be circulated for the purpose of obtaining the wish of this community on the disposition of the school. The motion carried. This will mean that those who sign the petition are not at this time asking for consolidation but merely a move to ascertain the wish of the community.

will, therefore, adhere to the policy which it has heretofore declared concerning this problem. This policy provides as follows: Whenever it shall come to the attention of any of the officers or agents of the Commission that any form of amusement device is apparently being used for the purpose of gambling or conducting lotteries in violation of law, the matter will be promptly reported to the District Attorney of the County involved. If a conviction is obtained for gambling or conducting lotteries upon licensed premises, the Commission will take such action regarding the licensee conducting such premises as may be deemed appropriate.

The statement was signed by chairman R. L. Elfstrom and Commissioner W. A. Spangler.

December 15. This is necessary to allow ample time for issuance of 1952 certificates by the new year, according to Administrator W. A. Bingham.

The mere act of filing an application for a 1952 license will not legally permit an operator to sell alcoholic beverages after December 31 unless he has a valid license certificate or a letter from the commission authorizing such sale, Bingham said.

Prospective licensees of the Oregon liquor control commission will be required after January 1 to post public notices of application on their premises before their applications are considered, the commission decided at its November meeting. The new policy provides that a placard be posted at least ten days before an application is submitted to the local governing body for approval. The commission states that the ten-day notification period was deemed advisable to give residents of an area opportunity to make known any opinions regarding the

establishment of a new licensed outlet.

The commission also directed the staff to file with the Office of Price Stabilization appropriate records of Commission prices and procedures used to determine the retail price of liquor sold in state agencies and stores. OPS requested that this data be filed before the first of the year so that the Commission could reprice all liquors sold by its stores and agencies in accordance with newly issued regulations of the Office of Price Stabilization.

Two regulations were revised by the commission. Regulation 1 was

changed to prohibit delivery of alcoholic beverages, including beer, to or from licensed premises after closing hours. This change will not prevent the delivery of a restaurant or club patron's bottle to him after closing time if he is not visibly intoxicated. A second revision established minimum lighting requirements in areas of premises where food and beverages are served and consumed at one foot-candle. The minimum requirement for portions of premises where food and beverages are prepared is still ten foot-candles.
