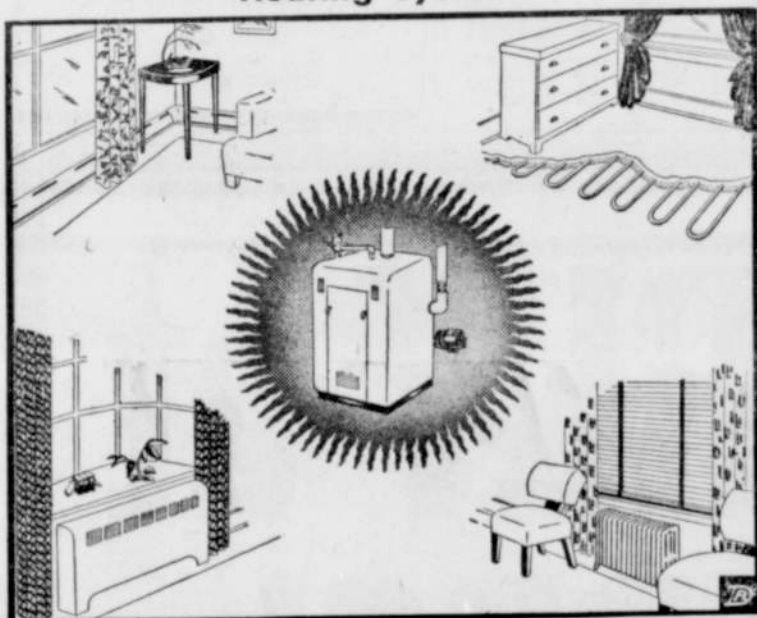

Summer Best Time To Improve Heating System



Summer is the ideal time to make improvements in the heating system such as the installation of baseboard heating units, new convectors, modern radiators, controls, or an automatically-fired boiler. Conventional radiators may be replaced with baseboard heating units. Extending about an inch from the wall, these trim heat distributors leave all the room's wall and floor space free and unobstructed. Convectors and slender-tube radiators are also popular in the modernization of heating systems. Replacement of old bulky radiators by modern convectors or new-style radiators add greatly to the beauty of interiors as well as providing additional usable space near windows. Many heating systems can be improved by the addition of modern controls. New types of thermostats are more sensitive than older models and thus save fuel as well as providing greater heating comfort. In larger homes, an indoor-outdoor control system may be advisable. There are special boilers designed for oil and others for the use of gas as a fuel. Replacement of older boilers with new boilers specifically designed for a certain fuel will increase the over-all efficiency of the heating system.

FHA Loans Available To Vets and Farmers

Loans to Veterans and other low income farmers are now available for the purchase of livestock, farm machinery, seed, feed, fertilizer, through the Farmers Home Administration. Farm machinery may include such equipment as tractors, combines, discs, harrows, etc. These loans bear interest at the rate of 5%, and in most cases, are repayable in a five year period.

Under certain conditions, these loans may be used for farm development, and minor building needs. These loans are available only to those who cannot get financed elsewhere, and their farm plan shows that they are able to pay out the obligation. Borrowers are urged to keep an account book, and make an annual farm and home plan for following modern and approved methods of farming.

Over 50 percent of the money appropriated must be loaned to Veterans, but the Supervisor, Martin H. Baker states that the loans to date are running fairly close to this requirement.

Housing loans are also available for farm houses, other farm buildings, and land development. These loans may run up to a period of 20 years, and bear interest at the rate of 4%. In some instances, the Government will take a second mortgage on the Real Estate, however, there is no money set up to re-finance present real estate obligations.

Application blanks are available at the County office of the Farmers Home Administration for Linn, Lincoln, and Benton county. This office is located in Room 222, Post Office Building in Albany, and is open daily from 8 to 5 except Saturdays. The Supervisor, Martin H. Baker is only in the office on Tuesdays, and other days only by appointment.
