

Do you know when-and when not tips: All police departments exist for three basic functions: the prevention of crime, the detection of crime and the apprehension of violators. Naturally, whenever you are a witness to a crime, you should report immediately to the police.

#### PEACE BY DECLARATION

India speaks for the world when it pleads for world peace. But it lags behind history when it urges a "nowar" declaration by the major powers

The tatters of the Kellogg-Briand Pact are a mournful reminder that peace is not made or kept by mere words. Written agreements must have behind them (1) good faith and, or (2) some form or degree of police power if they are to do more than deude the innocent.

The fact is that both the western powers and Soviet Russia already have signed a no-war declaration in subscribing to the Charter of the United Nations. Their desires for peace can best be gauged by their support of that organization, embody ing as it does a rudimentary sense of world community and at least the otentiality of enforceable world law Until already existing agreements
