Austin, a ghostlike mining town, near Baker, Ore., once had a population of 5,000 after gold was discovered there in the 1860's.

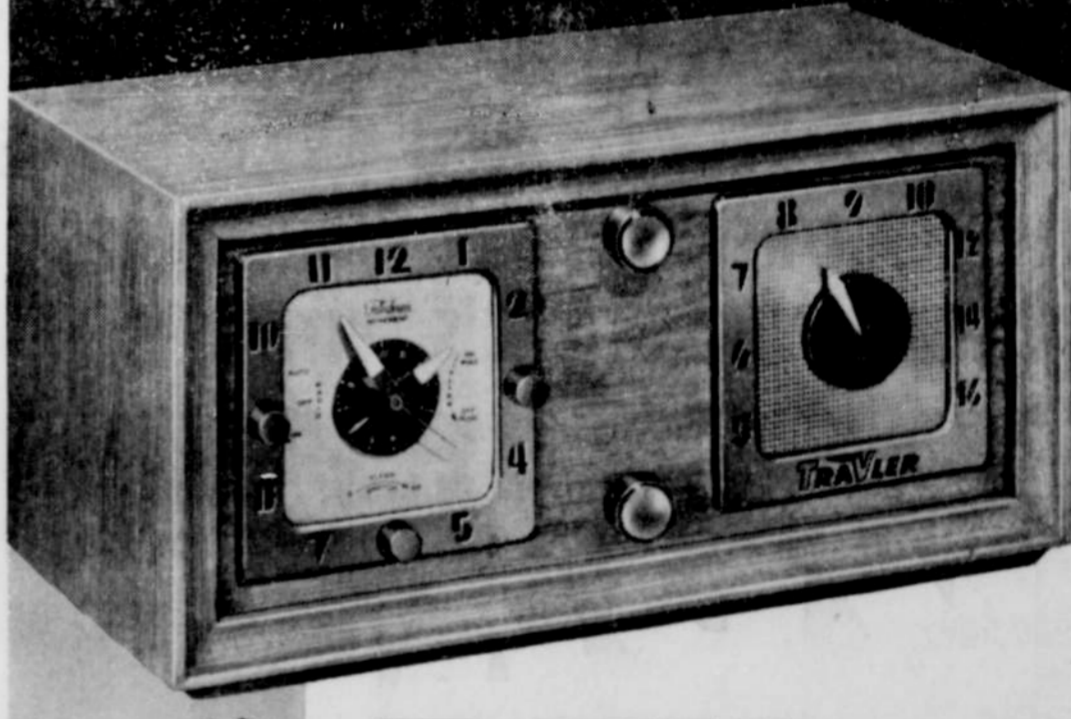
