Out of the Woods

Big Day for Trees...
It was soggy weather as the first "Tree Farm Field Day" of timber history dawned on the green land between the snow peaks of the Cascade Mountains and Puget Sound.

"Cold, dark and dripping woods," said the Forester William Tinney, the man responsible for the field day "But there should be at least two hundred folks that no weather can stop."

There were, in fact, four hundred and fourteen automobiles parked on the Valley Gem Farms Tree Farm near Arlington, Snohomish County, an hour after the show began. Estimators agreed that at least there were twelve hundred men, women and children who had come in cars to the farm woodland.

"Fifteen hundred, if you count public relations experts and camera men," guessed Forester Bill Tinney. "There was something in his guess. All Through the woods flash bulbs were popping like a swarm of fireflies. Tree farming is news today."

What is Tree Farming?

All along the flow of visitors, now halting, then drifting on, trickling away on logging trails to features in the timber, the metal hats of forester guides shone above raincoats and mackinaws. Some had worked for weeks with Tree Farm Owners John Wraga and Charles Grewe and Arlington Times Editor Jack C. Carpenter, on demonstration layouts of protection, pruning, thinning, pre-logging, salvaging, marketing, and other elements of good farm woodland management in the Douglas fir region, as roadside "show windows."

The purpose was to show, for the first time, factual and practical examples of how a woodland can be harvested under sound forestry practices to yield top cash values for material taken out in thinning operations, in the prelogging of small trees before main harvest, in principal harvest of full values from nature trees. An invitation had been mailed to four thousand. Press and radio had needed no experting to be induced to publicize the program generously.

A Prime Pattern...

The site was carefully selected by the Snohomish County Tree Farm Committee, made up of industry foresters, farmers, Soil Conservation Service specialists and Washington State Division of Forestry men. The total ownership was four hundred acres of farm woodland. The demonstration tract was on a paved highway.

The woodland road began with fern patch and stump pasture, scarred by many fires. Then an area of new Douglas firs, which had grown since the land was put under protection eight years ago.

Next, a pruning patch of saplings, promising future returns of \$45.00 per of forty-year-old trees wanting thinning. And so on, to the remains of a giant Douglas fir windfall which had lain on the ground for twenty-five years—and then had yielded sound logs that brought \$750.00 at the mill.

The farm owners were known all over the state as prominent Guernsey breeders and potato growers. The names of John Wraga and Charles Grewe stamped the project with value for farmer visitors. So the folks had dared the rain to come on, and out they drove to see the whats, hows and wherefores of tree farming. And the rain was good enough to back up and melt off in other directions as the American Legion served lunch in the woods.

Plenty of city folks came. Smith-Hughes teachers piloted vo-ag students from high schools of Snohomish County. There were grandmas in the woods. The cries of babies mingled
