NUMBER ONE on the Christmas gift parade this year, as in years past, is, of course, a brand new bicycle. When ordering a new 1952 model bike from Santa, be sure the size is right. 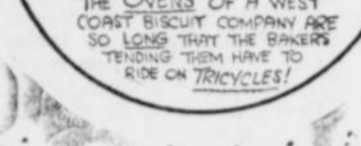
Soap And Water Best For Dogbite

Dogbite should be treated like any other flesh wound, and soap and water is still the most effective method of cleaning out the wound.

So states the Gaines Dog Research Center, New York, citing as its authority the findings of Dr. Raold T. Vinard, the physician usually washes out the wound with soap and water, cuts away dead tissue, and stitches up the wound. He may put a mild antiseptic on the surrounding skin, but he would never think of cauterizing such a wound with fuming nitric acid and then leaving it open. But if a patient comes in with a dogbite, he is all too likely to be subjected to painful cautery and perhaps scarred for life. The only thing that makes an animal bite different from an ordinary wound is the possible presence of rabies virus, and it was proved years ago that such virus is removed more thoroughly by soap and water than by nitric acid or any other of the cauterizing agents, he says.

On baking day, why not make two cakes instead of one, suggests Winfred S. Carter of Proctor & Gamble's Household Information Service. Freeze the second one and have it ready to frost and serve when unexpected guests arrive. Or, if yours is a small family, make a layer cake and freeze one layer for future use.
