The hostess for the Thursday afternoon card session, Mrs. Inez Teal gave useful and satisfying prizes and upped the spirits of the Lucky Twelve group.

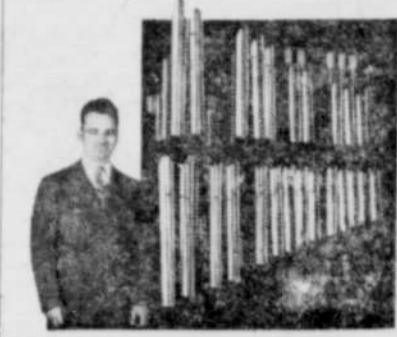

The large Triple Octave Chimes create a lot of interest because they are one of very few sets in existence today. One hundred chimes played in unison when played by two people give the effect of a large organ and bells. The Wallace's have a beautiful set of Swiss Hand Bells imported from Europe recently. The Marimba and Electric Vibraharp complete the list of percussion instruments. These musicians have appeared in more than two thousand cities for musical programs in colleges, high schools and churches during the past six years. Mrs. Wallace is well known for her Vibraharp arrangements and will play four of the large instruments. Mr. Wallace, in addition to playing the Bells, Chimes and Organ, will bring a poetic and Scriptural background to the program. Miss Laura Hamilton of the Sherwood Conservatory of Music, Chicago, is the pianist and will also play the other instruments.

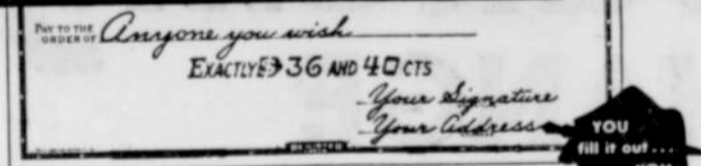
