"Check the following equipment on your car to see if it is in safe operating condition; windshield wiper, horn, rearview mirror, foot brake, hand brake, headlights and tail light, also see to it that your tires have sufficient tread and are properly inflated."

"And don't forget that all important driver behind the wheel. Many accidents are caused by negligent and drinking drivers."

Mill City has been very fortunate having had few serious accidents, taking in consideration the existing weather conditions, Chief Hunt commented. "We can cut down our percentage of accidents greatly if you motorists will take time to follow the above suggestions," he said.

Special attention to out-of-state motorists, who are gainfully employed in the canyon area, you should apply for your Oregon operators license and Oregon plates. It has been noticed that numerous cars in Mill City bear out-of-state plates which are invalid.

Anyone wishing to obtain an Oregon drivers manual, or information concerning Oregon plates may do so by either calling at the Mill City police department or contacting the officer on duty. Christmas Seal Sales Top 1951 Campaign

Christmas Seal sales soared above the 1951 mark this year according to this area's campaign chairman, Mrs. Melbourne Rambo. Mehama withdrew this year from the family of North Santiam communities united in the 1951 Christmas Seal drive. Mehama set up and carried out a separate Christmas Seal program, Mrs. Rambo indicated.

This year \$465 was the total sum collected by the organization headed by Mrs. Rambo. The drive closed during the Christmas holidays, but the books will not close until March 31. Money raised by Mehama Christmas Seal workers must yet be totalled.

During the Christmas Seal drive for 1951, \$450 was the total collected by the combined efforts of the communities of Mill City, Lyons, Mehama, and Gates.
