Refreshments were served by Jennie Davis, Laurel Brown, Nellie Ward and Ada Dart.

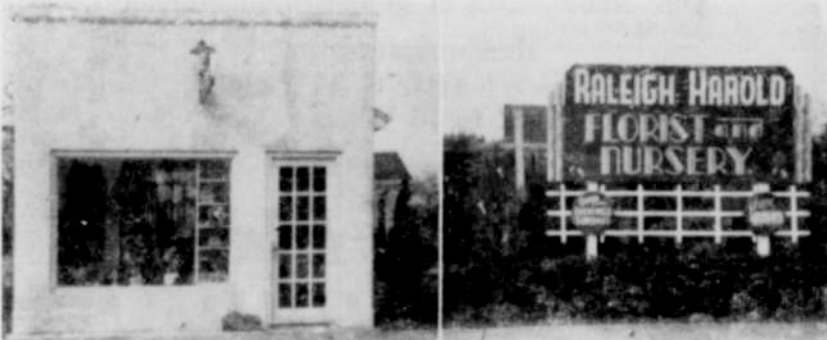
