and calmly passed after deliberation in a time of industrial peace. It is unfortunate that Congress must act during the heat of controversy. But Congress must bear its Constitutional burden or again the President will be forced to either claim "inherent power" or fail in his obligation to the people to protect their safety and security.

Of course in all these cases most commentators on the present situation overlook the basic proposition that there is always recourse to the courts if an administrative officer acts arbitrarily or unreasonably. If the industry is not an essential one or if the proposed action of the government is arbitrary or unreasonable then the courts can remedy the situation whether the executive has acted under an inherent power or under a direct grant of power by the legislative branch.

Labor and management alike must co-operate in obtaining from Congress a law that will protect the safety and security of the nation and fairly and equitably secure a continuance of the flow of essential war material to our fighting men in Korea. They must co-operate to protect the best interests of both groups in securing legislation that is directed alike at reluctant management and reluctant labor instead of the present unfair and one-sided law that has brought about the present crisis and required the executive to resort to claimed inherent power in an attempt to avert a national disaster.

amine the books and cancelled checks with the excuse that they were in boxes (in the building) and that she did not know where to find them and that it would take all day to locate them. I was informed that at 4:30 p.m. she would let me know when I could see the records in question. I had brought my nephew along who is just a few months short of 21 years of age along to help do the checking for me.

At about 4 o'clock Mr. Ramon Roberts called me and informed me that he had called the district attorney and was advised that a minor had no right to look at the books and that the board could set the proper time and place to examine the books of the district. I was informed that on next Tuesday night at the regular meeting of the board they would have the records open for my examination.

I contend that Mrs. Ross is the full-time paid clerk and school secretary of the district in an office and that my request was not unreasonable during the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. There was no reason for the expense of a phone call to the district attorney—is that call charged to the school district? They know that the public is entitled to examine the school records at any reasonable time—we are wondering just why it is so difficult to get to see those records. It makes us wonder what will be found?
