Beginning at three o'clock on the afternoon of the fourteenth, at the Scottish Rite Temple in Salem, the officers of Salem lodge will confer the first section of the degree after which an outline of the history of Masonry in Salem will be presented by R. V. Carleson who is lodge historian.

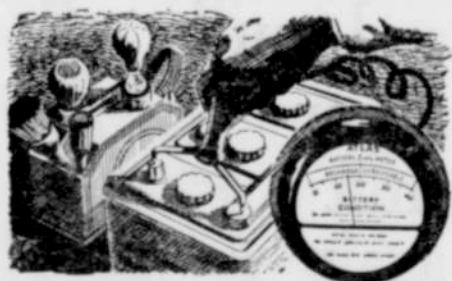

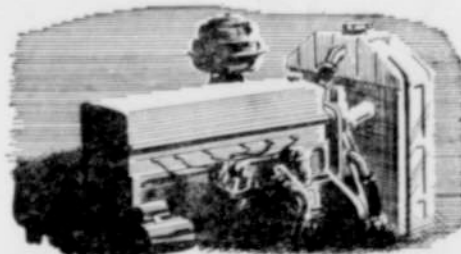
