Colonel Key is associate editor of the Christian Science religious periodicals and formerly served as a lecturer. He is a Christian Science practitioner and has been an authorized teacher of the religion since 1937. He first became active in Christian Science more than 40 years ago.

In World War I he was decorated by the British army with the Order of the British Empire, and granted the permanent rank of lieutenant colonel. He left the army in 1920 and in 1923 he began to devote all his time to Christian Science work.

Before and during World War II he served as district manager of committees on publication for Great Britain and Ireland, and in various capacities in connection with Christian Science Wartime Activities in Europe.

He will continue as associate editor during his one-year term as president. His new appointment was announced by the Christian Science board of di-
