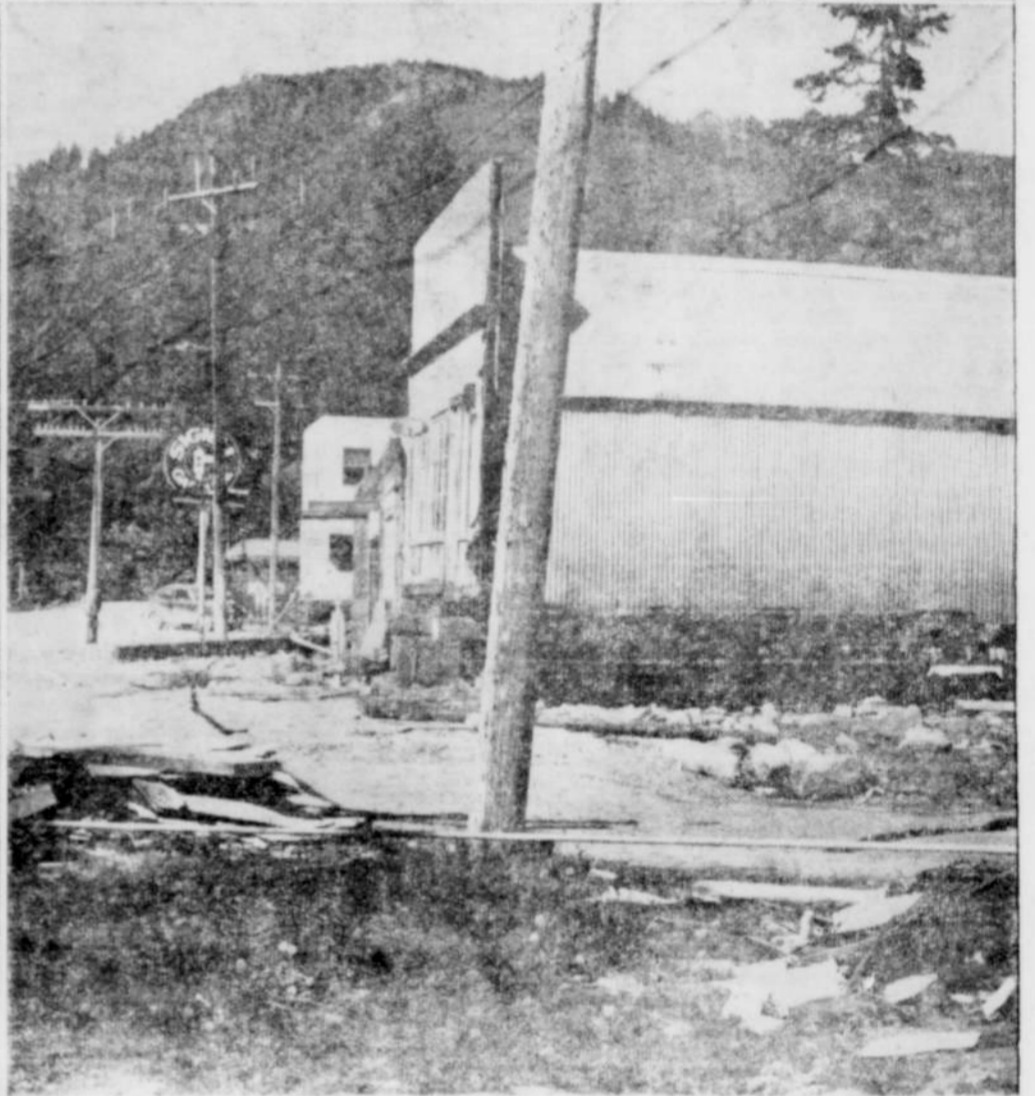
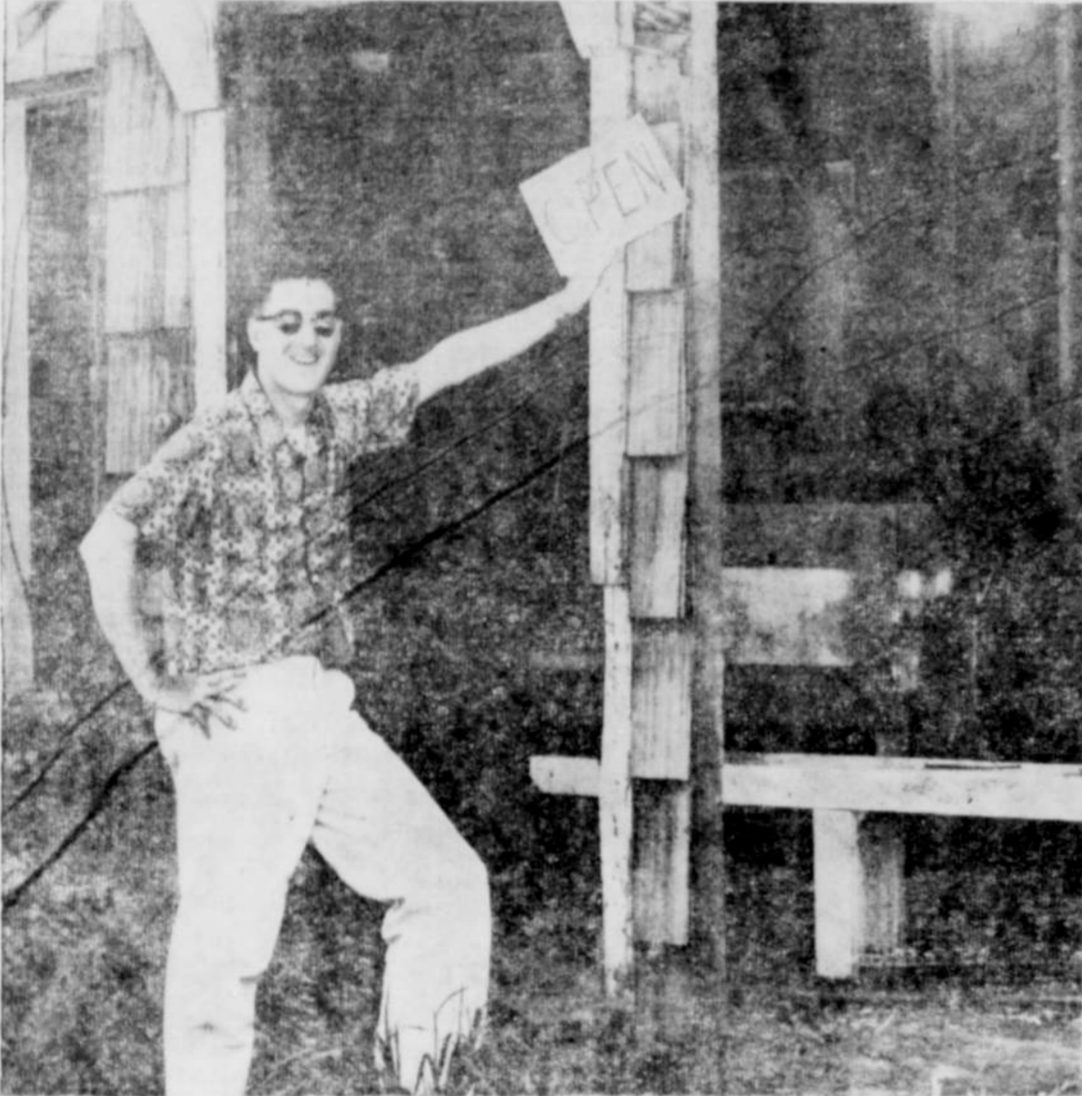

main, a sort of headstone for the Detroit that was. Lower left, a sign "open" takes on a rather humorous note as it hangs on the door of an old Detroit cafe which has also lost most of its walls. Lower right, the bustling old town is quiet now even in mid-afternoon. All that remains are a few jacked-up buildings yet to be moved, and the rubble of a doomed community which will be lost under the waters of the lake formed behind Detroit dam.
