indicates that today's estimate for Oregon's strawberries is the same as the May forecast. This is about a third larger than a year ago. The nation's crop is estimated to be around 2% smaller than expected a month ago. This decrease is due mainly to a short crop in the southern states. Figures for California are the same as last month. The Washington estimate has been shaded down a little while Michigan's has been upped some.

Processing Prices for Michigan Strawberries Not Named

Michigan processors are not quite as optimistic about prices to be paid for strawberries as they were a week ago. Up to Friday, June 6, no processors' prices had been reported. However, volume harvest was expected to start sometime this week. A few berries for fresh market were received on the Benton Harbor market last week and ranged in price from \$5.50 to around \$8.50 per 16-quart crate, according to quality. This is nearly a dollar above last year's early market.

Cherry Harvest Moving North

Sweet cherry harvest has been under way in California for some time and is expected to start in Oregon by the end of this week. The crop in Oregon is expected to be around 50% larger than last year's tonnage, according to the U. S. Crop Reporting Service based on June 1 conditions. The national sweet cherry crop is also expected to be about 50% larger than last year.

The total tonnage of sour cherries is expected to be slightly smaller than in 1950 and 1951 but larger than in other years.
