of leaks from passing through between the logs. Workmen will enter the tunnel when the small by-pass tunnel is closed and check for any possible leaks and seal them off before the work of pouring a 50-foot plug in the tunnel under the dam is begun. That work will proceed immediately as soon as water starts flowing through the lower regulating outlets in the dam.

I watched for a time from up on the highway view point after leaving the site of the workings, and was able to look upon the spot where not long before I had stood and see the lake forming where no man will probably ever stand again. We could see small bushes and stumps gradually disappearing in the water.

The builders will go on methodically doing the many tasks necessary to finish their job. The derrick will be dismantled and the other equipment will be moved out of the hole to make way for the rising waters as they come ever closer to the top level of the lake to be formed.

This canyon area has been fortunate to have this dam built here and now the time is approaching when the local people will take over and make use of their good fortune. A new road has been built and timber holdings opened up for exploitation. New cheap, public power is being made available, new people have already come into the canyon to inhabit the land.

There is much room for industry to expand in a wonderland and treasure of good living. It is now the time for the chambers of commerce to get in the saddle and do their work. We must not continue our backward march as some do when they report that fishing is "poor" in the North Santiam river. That is being selfish and unwilling to share our good fortune with others.
