

Liberal Republicans 'Old Guard' Captives

"The few liberal Republicans such as Senator Morse have become captive of the old guard by their championing of General Eisenhower," in the opinion of A. F. Hartung, president of the International Woodworkers of America, CIO-CCL (Canadian Congress of Labor) with headquarters in Portland, Ore.

"Though the defeat of Taft was generally looked upon as a defeat of the Hoover-MacArthur wing of that party, the party's new platform and choice of vice presidential candidate shows the very opposite to be true," said Hartung, highest elective official of the 140,000-member Woodworkers union.

"Eisenhower's choice of Senator Nixon as his running mate is highly ironic to say the least. After General Eisenhower's pleading for senate approval of our sending troops to Europe a year ago April, Senator Nixon—along with Senator Taft—was among the majority of Republicans who voted against it! Nixon is a junior Taft."

"Nixon also voted against aid to India last year, which is directly opposite to the so-called GOP policy in regards to increased aid to Asia. Nixon is a true example of the majority of anti-labor Republican legislators in our congress."

Hartung also charged that it was the Taft-Nixon forces which managed in December of 1949 "to cut funds which the Democratic administration advocated for arms and economic expenditure to aid South Korea. And then the Republicans had the effrontery to accuse the Democrats of leaving the door open for the Communist attack the following June. The Republican plank on foreign policy is a sham front put up to deceive the voters into thinking the administration and Eisenhower views on aid to Europe and Asia will not be dumped."

Hartung said the Republicans appear to have all but "abandoned labor. The contributions made by organized labor in the struggle against the totalitarian forces were completely ignored by this so-called rejuvenated political party."

"If Eisenhower is elected to the White House, Senator Taft likely will be head of the senate labor committee as well as GOP policy chairman in congress. According to the Wall Street Journal, Taft has pledged to obtain passage of laws to further restrict labor's civil liberties as to free collective bargaining. So far as I can see, General Eisenhower is in perfect agreement with Taft and Nixon in this field. And none of these men have repudiated the Hitler-Stalin methods of smear technique as identified by the word McCarthyism."

As to civil rights, the Republicans have "doomed themselves to lose most of the negro and labor vote because of their failure to adopt a platform which would call for elimination of the

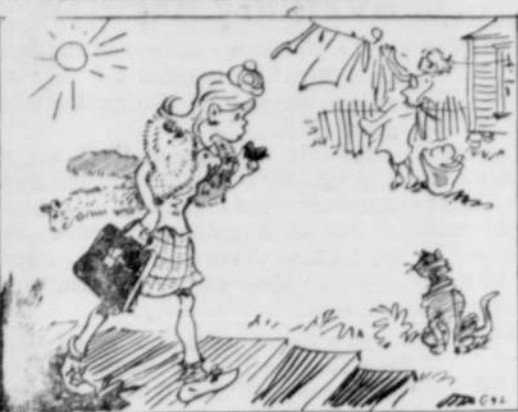

congressional filibuster which has prevented passage of an enforceable federal fair employment practices law," Hartung said.

"Vice presidential candidate Nixon has shown by his voting record that he opposes FEP legislation. Eisenhower admittedly opposes it."

"But if the Democrats adopt the same watered-down civil rights policy as that of the GOP, the Republicans will have a good chance of winning back those lost votes."

Hartung said he thought the "GOP opposition to federal health insurance also is in direct opposition to the majority of organized workers' hopes."

He commented on Republican condemnation of corruption by saying "neither party can claim a monopoly on cleanliness, as shown by the exposure of 'odd' deals made by ex-Republican chairman Gabrielson and ex-Senator Owen Brewster of Maine. If a poll could be taken of all the 5 percenters, the bribees, the income tax evaders and the other political crooks both in and out of office, I'll wager it would show a majority to be Republicans, if that means anything. The majority of Democrats are the working people who can't afford to support corruption."

As to Communism, Hartung said he recalled that some of the Communists exposed in public office were aides to Republicans as well as to Democrats, and "Communists make no differentiation as to what groups or parties they try to infiltrate. Both parties are pledged to the defeat of Communism. Labor thinks it can be done by helping our friends in other lands; the Republicans apparently want to concentrate their fire on the small percentage of fairly well-squeezed Reds at home."
