Detroit Schools Will Open September 8th

Detroit—Fall term for the Detroit school system is scheduled to begin September 8, the first Monday after Labor Day, with twelve teachers under contract to fill teaching positions for the combined grade and high schools.

The list of instructors and grades assigned to each includes Mrs. Alfred Cokenour, first grade; Mrs. Russel Hoyt, second grade; Mrs. Nola Rasmick, third grade; Miss M. B. Miller, fourth grade; Mrs. Gladys Claxton, fifth grade; Russel Hoyt, sixth grade; Al Warby, seventh grade; Mrs. John Ray, eighth grade; Mrs. Evelyn Gerhart, Miss Kazi Inuzuka, Mr. Kettle-son and O. J. White, high school.

Mr. White, Detroit school superintendent, will also serve as principal for the combined grade and high schools which will be housed in the same building.

The cafeteria will be in operation again with Mrs. Wayne Woodward in charge and Mrs. Rose Mermillion assisting.

Improvements on the school building and gymnasium are proceeding on schedule. Major changes, in addition to the shop room in the gymnasium and the home economics room adjoining the principals' office, include construction of porch roofs at each outside entrance. The roofs are designed to protect the doors from weathering and also to prevent collection of snow which has been a fire hazard in the past when doors were blocked by heavy snow on the unprotected porches.
