tions—and there were plenty of them—probably never will forgive Adlai Stevenson, the drafted nominee of the Democratic party.

His speech of acceptance, following one of President Truman's give-'em-hell attacks on the 80th congress, the Taft-Hartley act and the press—had terrific impact. It was far above any other speech made at either convention—in heart, mind and context.

Governor Stevenson labored under a terrific handicap. The hour was late. The delegates were exhausted. And they were understandably irked (as were millions of radio and TV listeners) by Chairman Rayburn's stubborn insistence that they wade through hours of senseless balloting, after Senator Kefauver had tried to throw his convention strength to the winner.

But Stevenson rose to the occasion. His short, scholarly, intensely earnest and moving address lifted his listeners right out of their seats. Some of them were in tears.

Stevenson dealt with the awe-inspiring responsibility of the presidency which he did not seek. He carefully avoided cheap partisan denunciation and abuse. He warned his fellow Democrats and his fellow countrymen that the ordeal of the 20th century, "the bloodiest, most turbulent age of the Christian era," is not over. He urged them not to be afraid of ugly truths. He told them straight from the shoulder that the years ahead require sacrifice, patience, understanding and implacable purpose if America is to serve its destiny. He declared quite bluntly that it will be better to lose the coming election than to mislead the people.

One telling paragraph summarized the Stevenson thesis:

"Let's tell them (the people) that the victory to be won in the 20th century, this portal to the golden age of man, mocks the pretensions of individual acumen and ingenuity. For it is a citadel guarded by thick walls of ignorance and mistrust which do not fall before the trumpets' blast or the politician's imprecations. They must be directly stormed by the hosts of courage, morality and wisdom, standing shoulder to shoulder, unafraid of ugly truth, contemptuous of lies, half truths, circuses and demagoguery."

It could have been Woodrow Wilson speaking, or FDR when he told America it had nothing to fear but fear, or Churchill exhorting the beaten Britons to stand fast. Instead it was a can who doesn't want to be president yet who promises to do the best he can do with "staggering task you have assigned me."

It was a great speech, one that will make some other convention speakers feel like stuttering schoolboys. And they won't love him for it. Our regret is that Rayburn's stubbornness prevented millions of Americans (who gave up and went to bed) from hearing it. Regardless of party, every American should have heard it.—From Oregon Journal.
