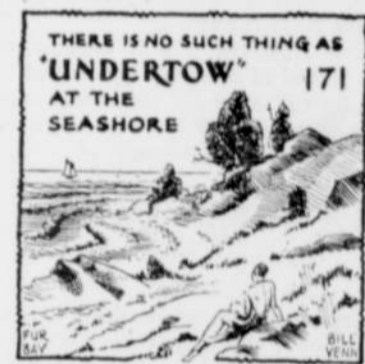

There is no such thing as "undertow" at the seashore. The popular conception of an "undertow" along the seashore is nothing but a myth, according to studies of Harvard geographers, and leading astronomers, who have studied this subject. They say that there is no evidence that the water is sucked underneath the surface in any such manner as is usually ascribed to "undertows." They say that the waves which lap up on the shore do not form any suction as they sweep back into the sea, and that swimmers reported to have been suddenly sucked down by an undertow were probably seized with cramps.
