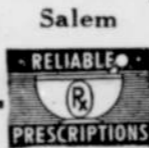

Editorial Comments--

SPARKMAN MADE SOME POINTS
Senator Sparkman didn't talk about civil rights Tuesday but he did have something to say.

The Senator said that states should receive federal assistance for improvement of schools.

He raised the issue of land reclamation against the Republican charge of "creeping socialism".

He leveled at Eisenhower's statement that the general will visit Korea immediately upon election and termed it a political move, pointing out that former visits by military leaders and members of congress have produced no ready solution.

Sparkman's address contained the usual political digs to be expected by both parties during the last week of the campaign. He took a swing at Joe McCarthy, Ike's "surrender at Morningside Heights," the Republican campaign of negation, the emotional factor in the Republican drive for the presidency.

Sparkman's speech emphasized two important points.

1. This is no longer the United States of the 1900's. The American system of free enterprise is open for modification which will aid the well-being of the people. If the best job can't be done by private business, local or state government, then the federal government should step in. It is the job which needs doing which must shape and delimit government, Adlai Stevenson has said.

2. Eisenhower has no real solution to Korea but is attempting to win votes by waving a bloody flag. Removal of U. S. troops from Korea would do more than lower casualties; it would lower the respect for the United States among free countries throughout the world.

Korea has become a symbol of the move on the part of the free world to halt Communist aggression. To withdraw now is to waste the lives of men who died on Korean battlefields. The task of the next president is not to see how fast we can get out of Korea but rather to see that we plant firmly the principles of non-aggression to which we are dedicated.—Oregon Daily Emerald.
