Unfair Practices of Speed Traps Target

"Speed traps" in Oregon and other various sections of the country that employ illegal or unfair practices through ignorance or design of enforcement personnel are due to be the major target of the American Automobile association and its affiliated clubs.

The Oregon State Motor association, affiliated with the AAA, has been advised of the contemplated procedure as a result of the resolution adopted at the recent Washington, D.C., convention of the association when there was sharp complaint against communities preying upon motorists with "cash register" justice.

The speed trap practices that will be watched include "police not in uniform or who use unmarked vehicles while on duty, where nons-standard traffic control equipment or devices of entrapment are used and where no reasonable opportunity is given to an accused person to have a hearing before an impartial magistrate."

Special attention will be given to motorists arrested and given hearings in "an atmosphere of bullying and intimidating the accused" and where the municipalities or other units of government do not maintain proper records showing the disposition of cases and fines.

Japanese brought in to fight the Chinese Reds. They much prefer to have Chiang Kai-shek's forces sent against the Chinese mainland, thus providing a welcome diversion. And they don't like the Japanese, to be quite frank. They haven't forgotten the Japanese occupation.

As we say, President Rhee and Choo may be a bit optimistic when they talk of doing the job alone. When they talk in terms of arming two million South Koreans, they're talking in terms of a combat army larger than the U.S. now possesses and from a country with one seventh our population and only a minute fraction of our resource.

But we admire their heroic fight for freedom. And nothing short of a free and united Korea will satisfy us, either. Anything less would be betrayal.—From Christian Science Monitor.

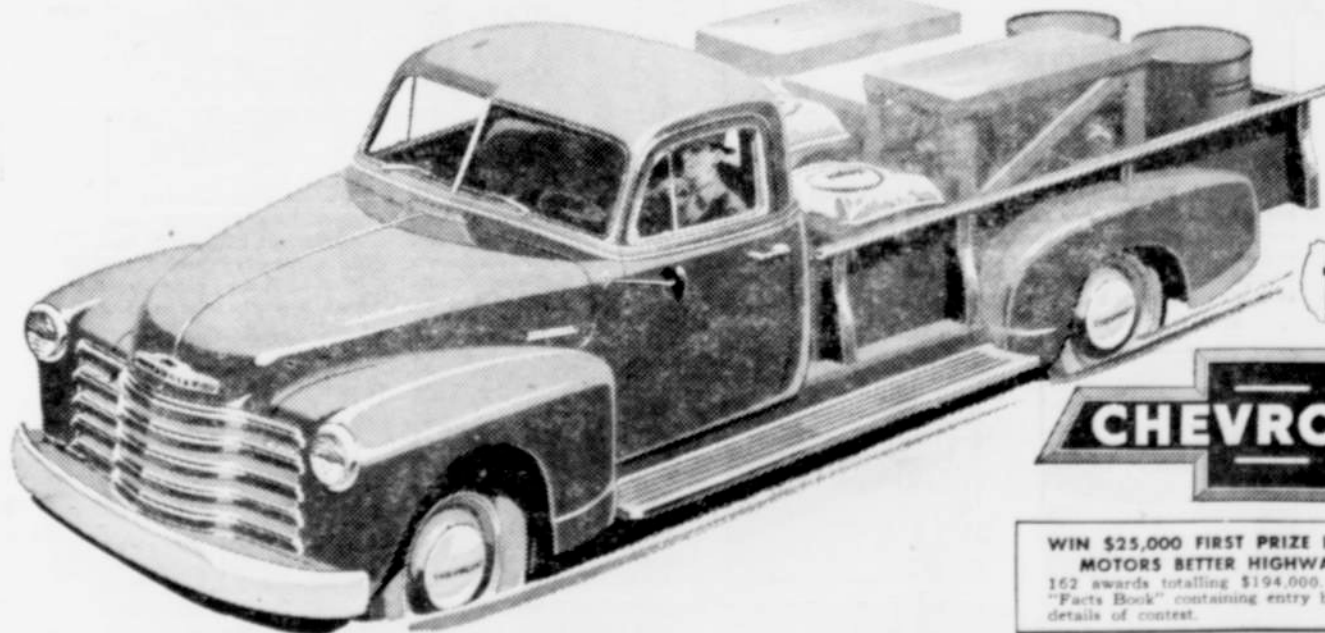
