The congress, sponsored by the American Medical association's council on industrial health, will be held in the Drake hotel.

Labor and management will join with medicine in a discussion of how the health of workers can best be maintained, it was announced by **Dr. Carl M. Peterson**, Chicago, secretary of the council. The Chicago Medical society and the Chicago association of commerce and industry will co-operate with the council in a presentation of community plans for health maintenance.

Other features will be discussions of occupational cancer, preventive efforts in industry, and human relations in occupational health.

On the day preceding the opening of the congress, there will be a joint conference of the Council of Industrial Health and chairmen of state medical association committees on industrial health. Included in the discussions will be health care plans, sponsored by management, union-management and private interests, for small-plant workers.
