Mr. and Mrs. Otto Weidman, George, Hazel and David, were Portland shoppers Thursday. George will leave Jan. 13 for the service.

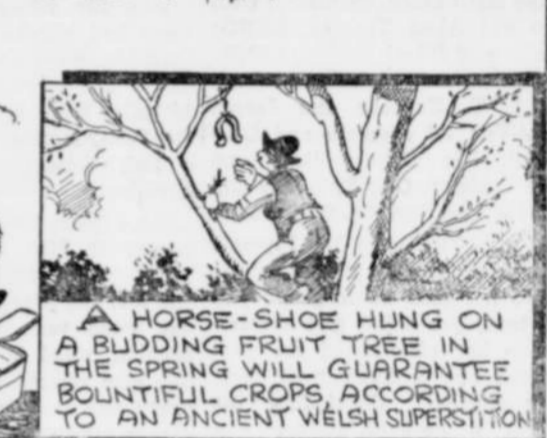
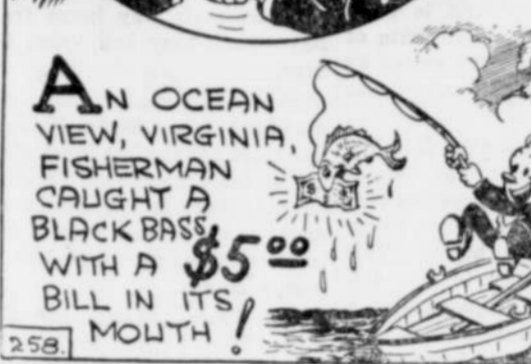
Paula, little daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Duane Downing, who has been seriously ill at the Memorial hospital is reported to be improved.
