Out of the Woods

THE SEED FLIGHT . . .
By Thanksgiving day in the forest, the leaves are fallen, the tree seeds are free from cone and stem and their flight is done. They lie on cut-overs, burns and fallows of the forest land, waiting for the mouse, the squirrel, the seed-eaters of the woods, or finding safety in the duff and the warmth of sprouting spring. In a poor seed year, and 1952 is one, the seeds go mostly for food.

Yet some will survive the winter, then swell with the life force of the forest in the spring, and lift stems and buds to the sun and air each summer.
The spruce in Canada and Maine, the cypress in Florida, the redwood in California, the Douglas fir in Washington and Oregon, the Ohio oak, and all the other species within this great North American wheel of trees are now in process of birth and growth in the great forest through the four seasons.

In autumn the drama of forest renewal begins. The winds blow. The seeds go forth. Trees for tomorrow are on the wing.

NEW FORESTS . . .
It is one of earth's oldest stories. An ancient account of creation tells it this way: "And the earth brought forth grass, and herb yielding seed after his kind, and the tree yielding fruit, whose seed was in itself, after his kind: and God saw that it was good."

Seed yield and seed flight are the heart and soul of the practice of forestry as an act on the land in our time — at least on the 461,000,000 United States acres that are classi-

fied as commercial forest land. As today's timber harvest goes over these acres the seed yield and sowing of nature follow the ax and saw.

Trees grow. Trees burn. Where fire kills the new crop and the parent trees, then artificial seeding or planting may be required. Where fire is kept out a forest will grow again, for another harvest. Its trees will be of the kind of the parent tree.

PULP OR PRUNES? . . .
Sometimes the tree species of the old forest is one that the land owner wishes to replace with another kind of tree. In the Lake States jackpine, aspens and scrub hardwoods grew after the logging of virgin red and white pine forests.

It happened this way: After the harvest the lands were burned over summer after summer for many years, in vain efforts to make poor soils produce pasture and farm crops. When the farms were abandoned the poor but fire-resistant tree species spread over the land.

Now millions of red and white pine seedlings are being planted each year in the Lake States. As they reach seed-bearing ages they restore the process of nature's seeding of tree land which the years of land-clearing fires set by men had interrupted.

In the Pacific northwest the white men have been trying for a hundred years to clear off the old forests and burn away new trees, to grow grass, cabbage and prunes instead of pulp-
