Oregon Bonus Exempt From Income Taxes

The Oregon bonus is exempt from state- and federal income taxation, along with most other benefits payable to war veterans or their survivors, the state Department of Veterans' Affairs reported this week. Other items excluded in computing federal and state tax returns are:

Bonuses paid by other states; GI insurance dividends; all education and training benefits, compensation and pensions paid by the Veterans Administration to veterans of any war including Korea; insurance proceeds paid on death of the insured; mustering-out pay and jobless benefits paid under the Korean GI bill; death gratuity pay; and social security benefits, workmen's compensation and sickness benefits.

Retirement pay for length of military service is taxed by Uncle Sam and the State of Oregon. Disability retirement pay is exempt from federal taxation, while Oregon taxes any amount in excess of \$1,500 with this exception—if the Veterans Administration had at one time been responsible for making the payment, then it is totally exempt.

Servicemen must pay federal taxes on their military income except for periods of service in Korea or adjacent waters, or for periods of hospitalization as the result of service in Korea. Any income taxes owed by a serviceman who dies on active duty as the result of service in Korea are forgiven by Uncle Sam.

tem of conveying chips from the chipper to the gondola cars will be installed for the first time in Oregon, it is believed.

The plant will use a floating pond saw equipped with "chain" rather than the usual "drag" saw for bucking logs to their proper length in preparation for the lathes. The plant is electrically equipped throughout.

For fire prevention the plant is equipped with a pressure system fitted with electric and diesel driven pumps. The system is fed from a million-gallon water pond located outside the 15-acre log pond. All the trash burner on the premises will burn is bark from the peeler logs and other waste not suitable for the chipper.

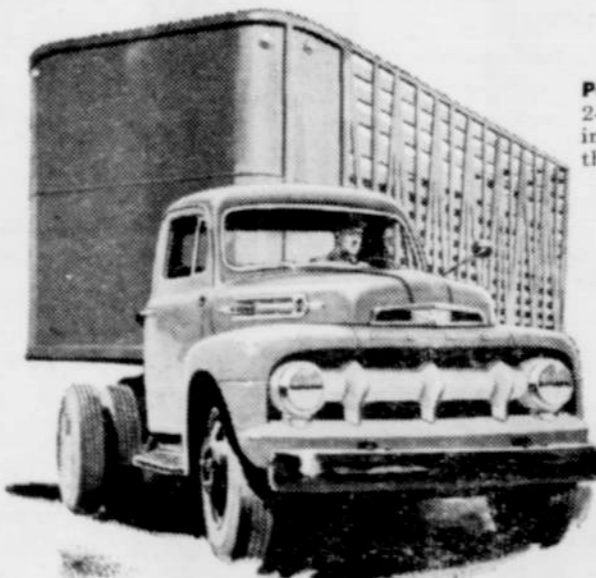

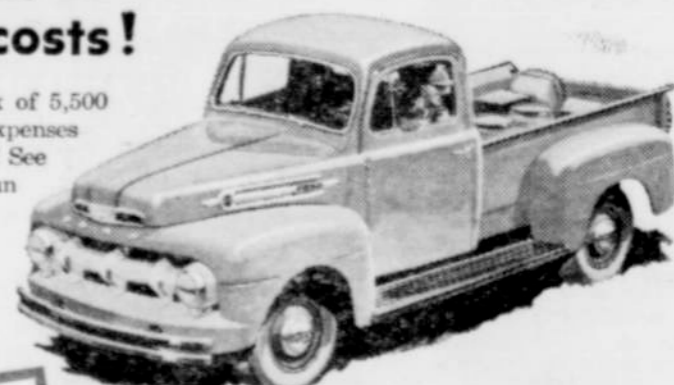
