The more money that is spent with your neighbor will make it easier for him to pay his share of the taxes and overall improvements of the district. So, by all working together in a co-operative program; the entire valley will be helped the most.

But the secret of a success of an adventure of that kind will be the bargain prices; I do not mean cheap prices nor cheap entertainment; but good food, good entertainment, inner coil springs on the beds, plenty of hot water and showers and "good roads that are safe"; for a few traffic accidents will hurt the district more than anything else.

If those who have auto courts will rent them cheaper than those renting either east or west of Mill City, why then people who did not intend to stop over will pass up the other localities and when they stop have the proper kind of a program to tell those who stop; about the "out-of-the-way" exclusive entertainments for those of good taste to enjoy and quote bargain prices and you will get people to stop over who never intended to stop and in that way you will get more money spent in the district than you will any other way.
