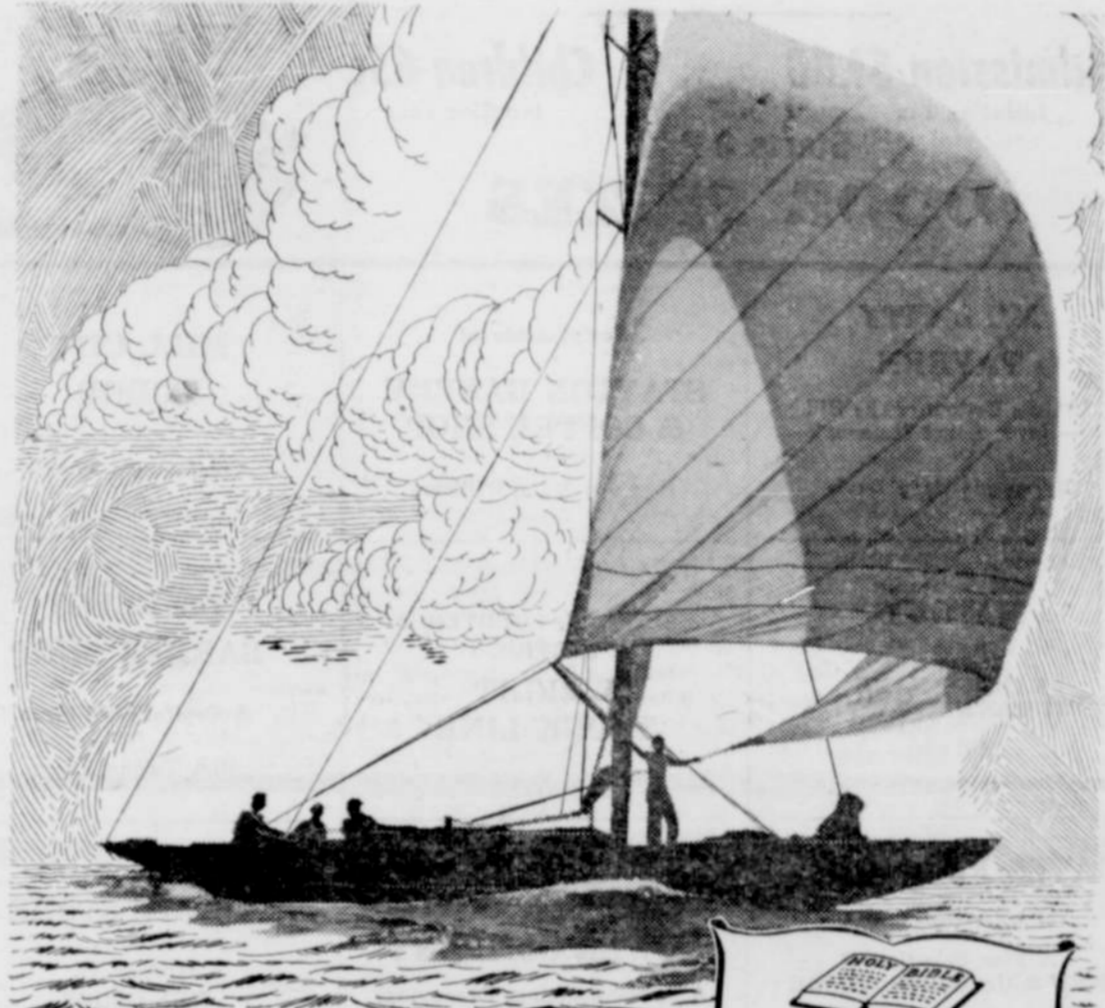
1. Have been a student body member at least six weeks.

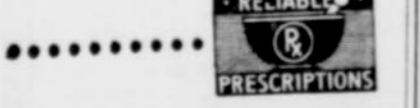
