Notice is hereby given that an election will be held Monday, May 18, 1953, in the Mill City Grade School, by the Rural School District of Linn county, State of Oregon, in all component school districts of said Rural School District.

The election will begin at 8 p.m. and will be held in the schoolhouse in each of said component districts. The purpose of the election is to submit to the legal voters of the rural school district the question of increasing the tax levy for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1953, over the amount limited by Section 11, Article XI of the Constitution.

The reasons for increasing such levy are:

1. Increased school population—added teachers.
2. Increased cost of fuel, electricity, supplies.
3. Teachers' salaries.

The amount of tax, in excess of the six percent limitation proposed to be levied by the rural school district of Linn County, Oregon, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1953, is \$824,000.79.

The program consisted of a parade at 2 p.m. through the streets of Salem. The column of Scouts and leaders was stretched out for 16 blocks, and took 45 minutes to pass a given point. After the parade, the boys went to Waters Field where they practiced for the evening show, and were fed by the Salem Lions. The meal consisting of all they could eat of hot dogs, ice cream, and cokes. The evening show started at 7:30 with the Grand Entry parade, mass color formation, and the singing of God Bless America. Rev. Dudley Strain of the First Christian church in Salem gave the invocation. Following this, there were Indian dances, chariot races, Boy Scout Flying Carpet races, Mardi Gra by the Cub Scouts, a Pioneer demonstration of Scout skills was also exhibited. The closing theme was a fire works display of the Forward on Liberty's team, Scout emblem, and the American flag.
