Bundles for Bankers: I received a letter from a listener who is irate because I have frequently mentioned the Treasury Department action which increased interest rates on government bonds. He demands to know why I have turned to this subject on several broadcasts.

That means that for every billion dollars worth of bonds, the American public is pledged to pay an additional \$975 million in interest charges during the life of the bond. That is the money that must come out of your cash registers, your market checks and your salary envelopes—and out of your children's incomes during the next 30 years. It enriches the money lenders—at the expense of the rest of the nation. You cannot avoid it. Understand it for what it is: Bundles for Bankers.

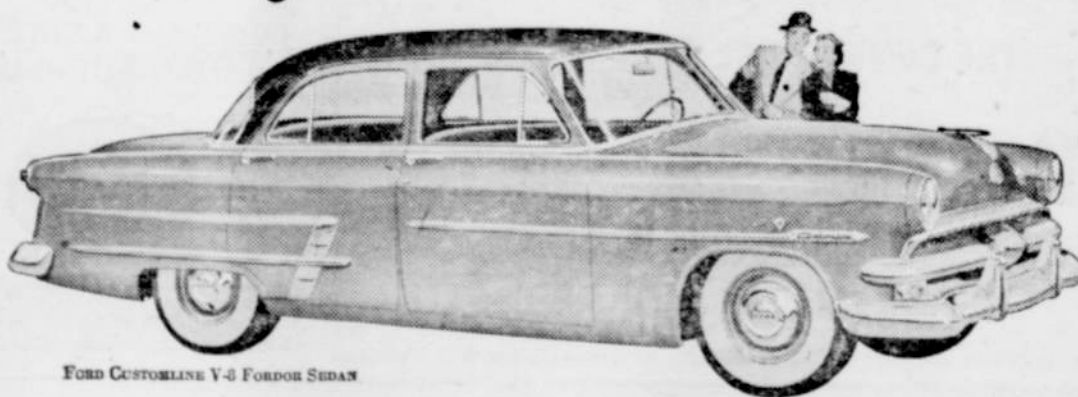
