## \$180,000 Will Be Spent On Mill City Niagara Road Job

The State Highway Commission has adopted an \$8,680,000 program of highway construction to be financed with federal-aid funds allotted to the state for the fiscal year 1955, supplemented by the usual 40 percent of match money required to be provided by the state.

In Marion county, the Portland-Salem Expressway, portion of the Willamette River-Hayesville section, grading and paving structures will receive \$630,000 and the North Santiam secondary highway, Mill City-Niagara section will receive \$180,000 for paving.

Under the federal regulations, the federal funds will be available for contracting about November 1, 1953 and the highway Commission will be ready to commence contracting the projects included in the adopted program very shortly after that date.
