Glen Shelton Named Pres. New Christian Church Sunday School District

Glen Shelton of Mill City was elected president of the newly formed Cascade Sunday School district at their last quarterly meeting of the year which was held at the Detroit Christian church last Sunday afternoon.

The district, which includes all Sunday schools in the communities between Idanha and Mehama, was formerly a part of the North Santiam district which extended to Turner. The other elected officers of the organization are Miss Sigrun Grimstad of Mill City, vice-president, and Mrs. R. D. Johnson of Detroit, secretary and treasurer.

The program which began at two o'clock, consisted of group singing led by Rev. Richard Hake, minister of the Detroit Christian church; devotions by Rev. Harold Martin, minister of the Mill City Assembly of God church; special musical numbers by Rev. Lee Joiner and Helen of the Mill City Community church; the business session; the message for the day by Rev. Noble Streeter, minister of the Mill City Presbyterian church; and benediction.

The convention instead of just being a meeting of fellowship is taking on the form of a workshop. It is hoped that it will make the teachers more effective in their Sunday school work by sharing their common problems.

The district is sponsoring a Scripture memorization contest between the Sunday schools within the district. The Mill City Ministerial Association compiled the list of Scripture which is to be memorized during the next three months. In the future it is hoped that the passages to be learned will be listed on printed cards to be handed out in each Sunday school. A plaque will be given to the Sunday school having the best memorization record on a percentage basis. The Sunday school which wins the plaque may keep it for a three-month period, and if they should win it three quarters in succession, they will keep the plaque permanently.

Due to the weather the basket lunch at noon was held in the Detroit school cafeteria instead of at the Lake-shore picnic grounds.

The next meeting of the Cascade Sunday school district will be held the second Sunday in January at the Mill City Christian church.

Five persons were injured here Friday noon in a two-car crash on the North Santiam highway. The mishap occurred in front of the Lake Cafe when a car piloted by Jules Hill, entered the highway from a side road, on the north side of the Santiam highway, in front of an east bound car driven by Honoras Ralphs of Aumsville.

They were taken to the Santiam Memorial hospital at Stayton by ambulance. Mrs. Ralph suffered a fractured jaw, their five-year-old son, Allen, received possible skull fractures. Mr. Ralph's and another son, Lloyd, 10, received minor injuries, as did Jules Hill, driver of the other car. They were treated and released.
