Elk hunters of Oregon are experiencing somewhat limited results thus far in the season.

Will Brown, game commission regional supervisor of northeastern Oregon, described the season there as slow. "The elk are away up on top and there has not been enough snow to push them down any", Brown commented Monday. He pointed out the Tollgate-Troy area as being the most productive to the hunters so far.

In the rest of the northeast area of the state, the elk are widely scattered. There is some snow at the higher elevations, but as Brown commented, the elk are in the timber and there has not been enough snow yet to push them down to the lower elevations.

In western Oregon, the hunters have had somewhat the same results. Hunting has been slow with the foggy weather partly to blame.

Elk season continues until November 22.
