Poisoned grain was the bait used in a recent week-long forest service project to poison rodents, particularly white-footed mice in the Parkett Creek sale area. Purpose of the operation was to insure germination of an unusually heavy seed fall in that area in a year of generally poor seed conditions.

C. T. Patterson of Redmond was awarded the contract for the building of two permanent reinforced concrete bridges, one at "Blowout Creek" the other at "Ivy Creek." Work began on Ivy Creek bridge about two weeks ago. The bridges are being built on forest service roads, but are financed by the M & M Plywood Co., under the terms of the timber sale from the forest service.

The bridges will revert back to the forest service, after they have served their purpose for M & M.

A six to eight man crew is employed on the Ivy Creek project and completion of the bridges is scheduled for June 1, 1954.
