

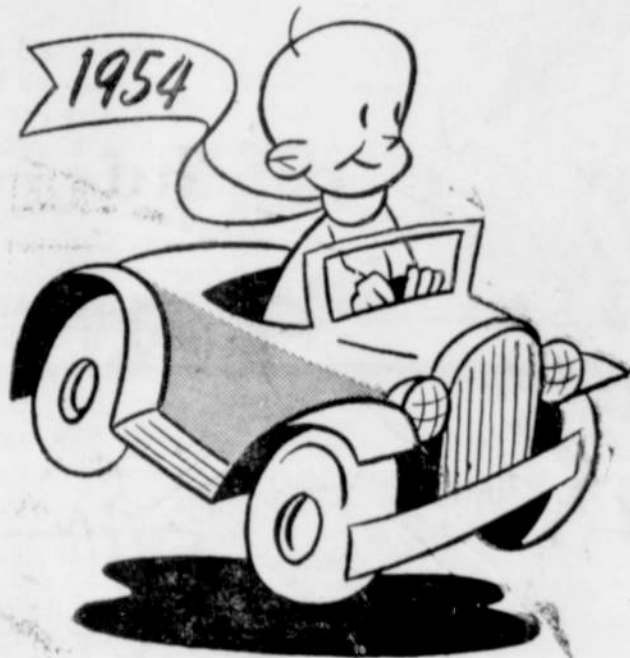

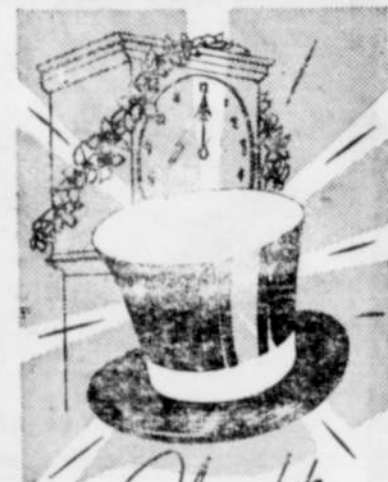
Hay Good for Hogs, OSC Specialist States

Hay has long been one of the staple feeds for workstock and cattle and it's just as good for hogs, says John Landers, extension animal husbandry specialist at Oregon State college. This is important when there's not enough green feed for brood sows in the winter, he continues.

Hog growers who don't have available green grazing for their brood sows can very successfully use a little alfalfa hay to add protein and vitamins to rations. The specialist recommends placing the hay in a rack and feeding it free choice.

Hogs probably won't eat more than a pound of hay each day, Landers explains. But the little hay they do eat will go a long way toward turning them into quality market animals.
