## Cold Winters Effect Highway Conditions

Changing temperatures, plus rain and snow, can be the downfall of an unwary motorist, the state traffic division reminded Friday.

Weather conditions in all Oregon varied greatly, safety men said drivers should remember that temperature changes present a real hazard to those who do not continually "get the feel of the road."

The driver who starts out on an icy

road early in the morning while it is still quite cold. He finds traction and stopping ability fairly good. But as the sun comes out, temperature rises and the ice becomes much more treacherous.

Studies reveal at 20 miles an hour when the temperature is zero, stopping distance on ice is 110 feet. But when the mercury rises to 32 degrees above zero, stopping distance

for the same speed is 250 feet, a difference of 140 feet.

Safety men also warned that ice or slippery spots can sometimes can be found on bridges when other sections of the roadway are bare. Unless a driver is aware of this hazard, a bad skid is likely.

The one sure way to keep in trouble is to run from it.
