All Power Driven Logging and Mill Operations to Have Permits This Year

The state board of Forestry announces in Salem that a total of 16,232 logging and mill permits were issued during 1953 or practically the same number that were recorded in 1952. A total of 16,272, highest in the state's history, were issued in 1952.
Officials indicate that both years were exceptionally high to the previous years as 1949 when 10,702 permits were issued.
Beginning January 1 of this year, permits for all power driven operations will be required for both western and eastern Oregon. Prior to this year permits were required only for Western Oregon operators, now, all operators must get a combined forest and conservation permit from the state forester.
Law requiring operation permits came as an aftermath of the first disastrous Tillamook fire in 1933. Since that time, permits have been used as a means of reducing fires in logging operations and protecting seed sources on timberlands. In 1953, loggers were charged with 60 fires.
