### Removal of Garbage and Refuse From Highways Costs Large Sum Yearly

It costs Oregon \$14.11 a mile to remove garbage and refuse from its 7,328 miles of state maintained highways during 1953, according to a report recently issued by the State Highway Commission.

Total expenditure for highway housecleaning in 1952 was \$103,400. This cost included the regular cleaning of rights-of-ways and the servicing of 349 garbage containers strategically and waysides. Largest cost was for parks along U. S. Highway 101, the coastal route, totaling just over \$4,000.

In addition, the Oregon State Parks Division of the Highway Department spent \$8,900 for garbage disposal at 73 locations in the state roadside parks port recently issued by the State placed along the highway system.

In all the Highway Department spent \$112,300 in 1953 to keep its highways and facilities clean for the convenience and enjoyment of the traveling public.

### Miles D. Hoeye Located On Ship Near Guam

Miles D. Hoeye, fireman, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. George W. Hoeye of Mill City is serving aboard the escort vessel USS Hanna which operates out of Guam as a search and rescue vessel.

The Hanna is on 24-hour alert and cooperates with the U. S. Air Force in cases of ship or plane disasters around the Guam area.

Recently the ship took a special Far Eastern cruise for a week of rest and recreation in Japan. The ship also visited the Pacific Islands of Truk, Ponape and Chichi Jima.
