Mill City Places Sixth in OSD Relays

Mill City high school placed sixth in the relays at the Oregon Deaf school last Wednesday. Gervais dominated over the rest of the schools in the league by collecting 60 points, as compared with 32 by Seio, the closest contender that afternoon.

Mill City placed sixth with a total of 16 1/2 points. Six of these came from a first place 440-yard relay tie with Gervais. Mill City 440-relay men were Al Ward, Elton Gregory, Rich Thomas, and Lloyd Ross. Five more points came as Mill City placed second in the broad jump relay. The Mill City broadjumping team was Elton Gregory, Al Ward, and Rich Thomas. Even though Gervais' three man total was greater than Mill City's, Al Ward came through with the longest jump of the event. Mill City tied with OSD for third in the high jump relay. (Jack Melting, Rich Thomas, and Lloyd Ross.) Fifth place in the shuttle hurdles was gained by Lloyd Ross, Larry Harrington, Chuck Kuhlman, and Don Lemke. Don Ellingson pole vaulted Mill City into a third place tie with OSD and Gervais.

Gates high school placed fifth in the relays with 18 1/2 points. Allen Vail and Herb Romey led the show as Vail won the 100 yard special and Romey placed second in the javelin, besides getting the longest put in the shot put relays, in which Gates placed third. Vail also ran in the sprint medley, in which Gates placed third, and in the broad jump relay, in which Gates tied OSD for fifth.
