

Basic School Funds Distributed to Districts

State basic school fund warrants aggregating \$10,306,702.67, were issued recently by Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry.

The amount represents the final 30 percent of revenue received under the 1953-54 basic school fund tax levy under which the school districts have received a total of \$31,761,119.74 during the year.

Of this current amount distributed, Linn county received \$457,237.36 and Marion county \$560,371.13.
