GOD at home

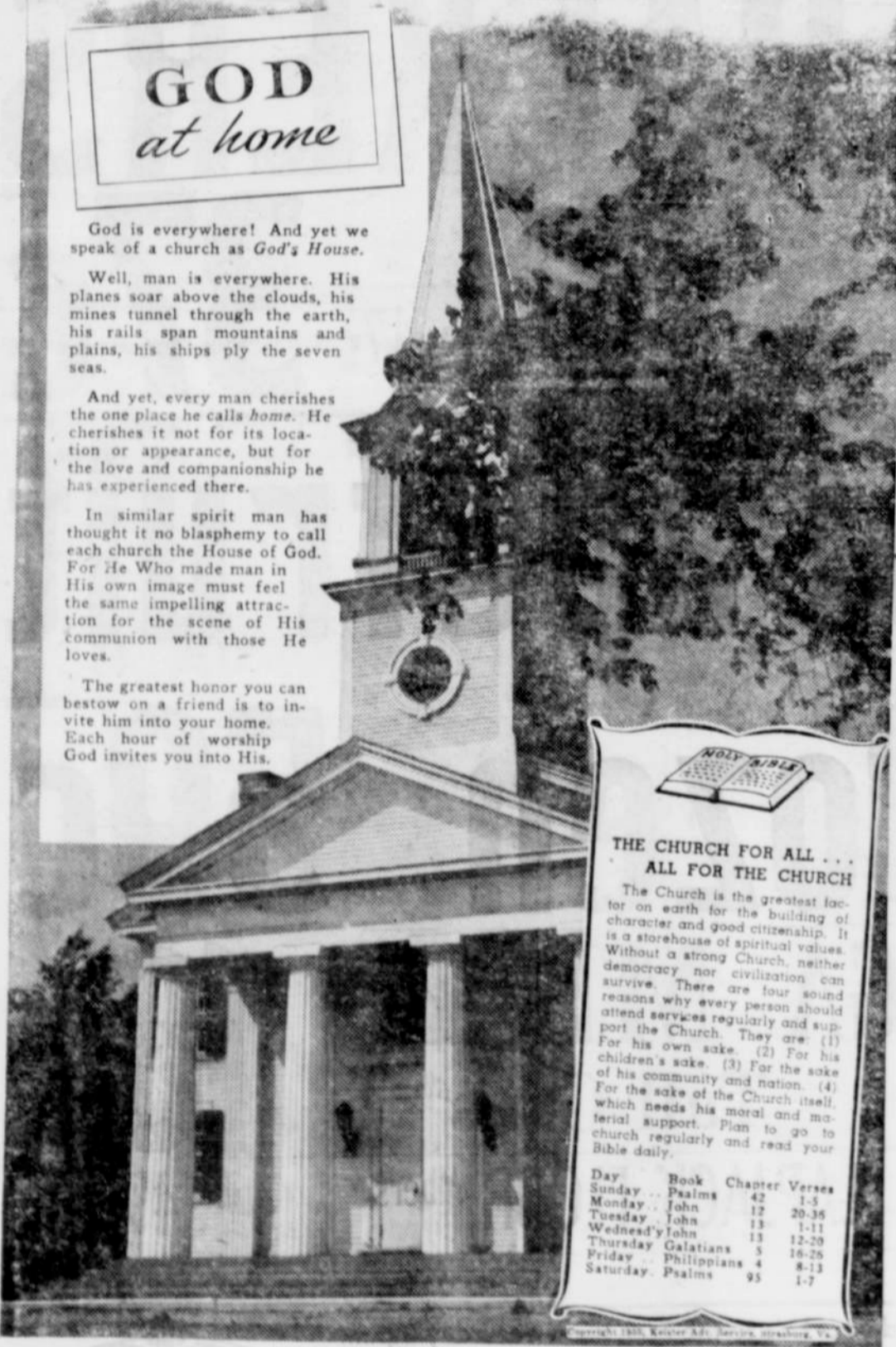
God is everywhere! And yet we speak of a church as *God's House*.
