Motor Vehicle Fees Given To Counties

An allocation of \$149,753.61 has been made to Marion county representing the county's 19% share in motor vehicle fees and taxes, Secretary of State Earl T. Newberry announces. Allocation of these funds to the counties of the state is predicated upon the number of registered motor vehicles. Marion county received the third largest amount from the fund

being topped by Multnomah county with \$671,344.52 and Lane county with \$205,727.19.

The allocation made Thursday represents the fees and taxes collected during the period from April 1 to June 30, 1955.

The allocation for Polk county totaled \$34,770.49; Linn county, \$83,873.49 and Yamhill county, \$52,538.28.

Another apportionment of \$3,585.73 to Marion county was announced, this coming from the Amusement Device Tax account.
