NOTICE OF REGULAR ELECTION
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, in accordance with Chapter 6, Section 23 and 24 of the charter of the City of Mill City, Oregon, that on the 8th day of November, 1955 there will be held the regular annual election as follows:

1. To elect two Councilmen to serve a three year term of office on the Common Council, of the City of Mill City as required by Chapter III, Section 8 of the City Charter.

2. To elect a Mayor to serve a two year term of office as chairman of the Common Council of the City of Mill City as required by Chapter 111, Section 9 of the City Charter.

The election will be held at 2:00 o'clock P. M. and will continue until 8 o'clock P. M. on November 8, 1955. The precinct and polling place will be at the City Hall in the City of Mill City Oregon.

The Judges and clerks of said election are as follows: Elma Stewart, judge; Altha Grimes, judge; Lettie Swan, clerk; Ann Holman, clerk and Mel Robinson, clerk.

Witness the hands of the recorder and mayor of the City of Mill City, together with the seal of said City, upon the 18th day of October, 1955.

NOTICE OF BOND SALE

Sealed bids will be received by the undersigned until the hour of 8:00 P. M. on November 8, 1955, and immediately opened by the Common Council of the City of Detroit, Oregon, at the Detroit School in said city for the sale of bonds, known as Water System Bonds in the amount of Twenty Five Thousand (\$25,000.00) Dollars issued pursuant to the authority vested in the Common Council of the City of Detroit by the legal voters of said city at an election held December 27, 1954 enacting the Charter of the City of Detroit, Oregon, and pursuant to Ordinance No. 18 of the City of Detroit, Oregon said bonds being described as follows:

Water System Bonds, in denominations of One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars each, said bonds to be dated January 1, 1956, to bear interest as hereinafter stated, and to mature at the rate of \$2,000.00, serially in numerical order, commencing on the first day of January, 1957, and including the first day of January, 1961, and commencing with the first day of January 1962 at the rate of \$1,000.00 to and including the first day of January, 1976, and said bonds shall bear interest at a rate not to exceed six (6%) per cent per annum, or such smaller amounts as may be fixed by the Common Council, payable on the 1st day of July and on the 1st day of January of each year, principal and interest to be payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the Treasurer of the City of Detroit, Oregon. At the option of said City, on any interest-paying date at or after the expiration of ten years from the date of said bonds and pursuant to publication of notice any or all remaining bonds may be redeemed.

This bond is a general obligation of said city and is secured by a pledge of the net revenue of the water system but only to the extent necessary to pay the principal and interest hereof.

The bonds will be sold to the highest bidder, but the Common Council of the City of Detroit, Oregon reserves the right to reject any or all bids. Unless all bids are rejected the bonds will be awarded to the bidder

complying with the notice of sale and submitting the bid which provides the lowest cost to the City of Detroit, Oregon.

Each bid must be unconditional, must be accompanied by a certified check or cashier's check in favor of the City of Detroit, Ore., of or upon a bank doing business in the State of Oregon, in the sum of \$2,500.00, and must be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the undersigned and marked on the outside "Proposal for Bonds." No interest will be allowed on the deposit with the bid, but the check of the successful bidder will be retained as part payment of the bonds or to secure the City of Detroit, Oregon against any loss resulting from failure of the bidder to comply with the terms of his bid.

Each bidder shall include in his bid a statement of the total interest cost to the district, if his bid be accepted, PROVIDED NONE OF THE CALLABLE BONDS OF THE ISSUE ARE REDEEMED PRIOR TO FINAL MATURITY DATE.

The successful bidder will be furnished with the legal written opinion of the law firm of Messrs. Winfree, McCulloch, Shuler and Sayre, to the effect that the bonds constitute the valid and legally binding obligations of the said City of Detroit, Oregon.

The bonds will be delivered complete, without undue delay, at the expense of the City of Detroit, Oregon, at such city in Oregon as the successful bidder shall name.
